Society of Lebanon the Giver Celebrating 34th Anniversary

The Society of Lebanon the Giver celebrated its 34th anniversary at their annual Gala on the 7th of October 2017, at Leyland Venue Hall, Aley – Lebanon.

The event was held under the auspices of Mrs. Lama Tammam Salam and a host of deputies including current and past ministers as well as other members of Lebanese society.

President of the Organization, Princess Hayat Wahab Arslan, took the stage to greet and welcome the distinguished audience. She went on to address the role of women in the Lebanese Constitution.

Among the accomplishments of this Society is the founding of a health Clinic for Women in Hasbaya, Lebanon, not to mention a roster of medical, cultural and developmental programs. All of which have been highly successful and effective.

The Society of Lebanon the Giver was established on July 1, 1983, licensed by the Lebanese government, Decree #157/AD.

Its main concern is development and help which varies from educational, cultural to social awareness serving the needs of the impoverished Druze community in many areas of Lebanon. Since its inception they established the following:

The New Generation School in Hasbaya, Lebanon was founded in 1983 to cater for the educational need in the region.

The Lebanese Artisanal Cooperative established in 1993 to help people sustain themselves specially women with little or no education and no opportunities for work. They are trained to produce handicrafts and exhibitions are organized to sell their products to ensure the continuity for the artisan and revenue for the “Society” to pursue its mission.

Technical School in Aley, Lebanon was established in 1997 for handicrafts domain with concentration on painting on silk and hand embroidery as well as machine classes embroidery. Make-up and Hair Dressing were added. Every year more than 80 women graduate with different skills which enables them to either find jobs or work from home.

The Women’s Clinic in Hasbaya, Lebanon was established in 2002 to satisfy an urgent need for medical care. The conservative society in the region and the lack of women doctors were basic in implementing the idea and thus the clinic is restricted to women and children with more than 2000 treated annually.

Reflections from Beit Al-Yateem Visit

During a 2017 summer trip of Lebanon, President of DOCO Dr. Farid Muakkassa and his family visited the Druze Orphanage in Abey, Lebanon and hosted 25 orphans for a luncheon at Al-Hawr Restaurant in al-Basateen, Lebanon. His three sons, Camille, Kareem and Ryan had an opportunity to interact with the children up close. His visit to the orphanage was a moving experience for 11th grader Kareem who shared his thoughts on this experience.

“In Lebanon, I was privileged to share a lunch with 25 of the children at the Druze Orphanage. From the second I saw the kids get off the bus until I saw them waving and clapping as we said goodbye, the kids never failed to have a smile on their faces.

Although they were poor and did not even have a father or mother to take care of them, they were the nicest kids I have ever met. My brothers and I ate with them and talked to them and lastly, played with them for only 3 hours, but it felt like time froze.

Listening to their stories and their jokes, we were filled with all kinds of emotions, and wouldn’t trade that feeling for anything. We promised them that we would see them again this upcoming summer, and I intend on keeping that promise no matter what.”

In Abey, they joined the celebration of Beit Al-Yateem's 75th anniversary. They met with Mrs. Hayat Al-Nakadi who highlighted the latest developments. The orphanage has

been instrumental in sheltering and educating thousands of Druze children over the years. It continues to grow and add more programming to enrich the lives and education of the orphans.

Next stop was at the Elderly Center at Ain Wazein Medical Village, where they met with Dr. Shawkat Beani, Director of Long Term Care Unit at Ain Wazein Medical

Village and Mrs. Amal Rasamny, Volunteer Coordinator at the Long Term Care Unit. Their newly added facility provides much needed additional housing for long and short-term elderly patients. They have also opened a mental health care facility to meet the needs of the community.

Next visit was to the newly acquired and renovated University Student Residence (USR). The amazing seven-story building is well equipped for housing female students from all areas across the mountains of Lebanon. The executive committee chair, Mrs. Farida Rayes, announced that these

rooms are available for rent to any student wanting to visit Lebanon in the summer months, for a nominal fee.

The Secondary School Organization founded by Mrs. Amal Shantouf has been helping students bridge the gap between Brevet and college education by enrolling them in high schools. In 2016, they provided almost 100 scholarships. 787 students have benefited from SSO educational program to date. 140 students graduated from high school with baccalaureate part II, 40 students graduated from college with BA/BS degree and few with MA

degree. 80 students are currently enrolled in different colleges from 1st to 4th year. 76 students are currently enrolled in high school, grades 10-12.

Last but not least was a stop at the Aley Public Library, chaired by Mrs. Anissa Shouhayeb Jaber. The library is accessible to students of all grades. It is equipped with both fiction and non-fiction books. The library also offers programs for kids such as craft and storytelling sessions, as well as educational and informative seminars and events for youth and adults. Many of the seminars concentrate on chronic and prevalent health issues and preventive measures.

Aley Ladies Assembly



The Aley Ladies Assembly was founded in 1975 by a group of volunteers to serve the social and medical needs of the communities of Aley and its surroundings.

The assembly is comprised of dynamic and educated women who are focused on fulfilling several objectives listed as follows:

- To strengthen the social bond among the NGO's of the region.
- To support the medical needs of the poor and the needy in the area.
- To help youth and adults grow their mental and cultural capabilities through reading books, attending lectures and learning about technology by the free use of a public library. The Public Library of Aley is a non-profit organization run by volunteers.

Secondary Schooling for the Orphans

Secondary Schooling for the Orphans (SSO) is a not-for-profit organization established in July 17, 2001 in Lebanon to support orphaned students who have finished 9th grade and are eager to continue their education but lack the means to pursue it. SSO is chaired by Mrs. Amal Shantouf.

SSO started by sponsoring ONE student to fulfill his dreams of higher education, by providing him a full scholarship and assistance to enroll in high school. Between the years 2001 and 2016, a record number of 787 students graduated with high school diplomas (Baccalaureate part II). 12 students graduated with a B.A. degree and 30 continued higher university studies and one student graduated in year 2011 with an MBA degree. This year, SSO enrolled 97 students in High School as well as 21 college freshman and senior students

The Library, founded in 1980 serves around 100,000 inhabitants in the region, including 30 schools and 3 universities. It has 15,000 books in Arabic, French and English and several computers with free internet access. The library allows the readers and internet users of the region to meet, discuss and interact with each other.

A corner for young children was added to foster the love of reading in the youngsters' minds. Storytelling and arts and craft are part of this corner.

The Library provides many opportunities as listed below:

- Students and residents are given the opportunity to read books and conduct research in three languages, Arabic, English and French.

in different schools and colleges.

All recipients are tracked and supervised to make sure they are doing well academically, socially and psychologically. SSO also provides for transportation, books, uniforms, and pocket money. Living expenses, tutoring and medical services are provided as needed.

A luncheon is held at the end of each academic year to honor the graduates and to welcome the new scholarship recipients. SSO's mission has been very successful and exceeded all expectations.

With a humble beginning of enrolling a single student in the SSO educational program, SSO has grown its educational program to support 65+ students annually for the last few years.

Please help us to continue their honorable mission.

Children are encouraged to use the facility, promoting reading. A club within the library was created for children aged 6-14 years old. This club helps children foster their talents through reading, writing, arts, theatre etc. Writing and poetry competition are held yearly. A 13 year old member of this library won a national prize for composing the best short story among students from 30 schools.

The elderly also can find refuge at the library where they can find books to read and attend lectures of interest.

Art exhibitions are organized periodically where young and old can present their work to be viewed by professionals and visitors.

Lectures and workshops are held periodically, important topics such as women's and children social and medical issues, environmental problems, cultural and social concerns are all tackled.

Public schools in Aley do not have libraries, because of that and with the cooperation of The Ministry of Education, The Aley Public Library hosts over 200 students from these schools on a monthly basis.

Private tutoring is provided free of charge to students with learning difficulties attending the public schools of the area.

"The Pleasure of Writing" workshop is held for children (7-8 years old). Last year this workshop resulted in a published book entitled "When children write and draw".

Musical training sessions are held 2 hours weekly for students to practice their musical instruments under the supervision of well qualified teacher. This has led to the formation of a musical band which participates in many events in the region.
